Since 1973, California High School, locally known as Cal High, has provided students with an enriched and challenging academic program by piloting and implementing innovative programs and instruction. Located in San Ramon, our student body is reflective of the surrounding community and greater San Francisco Bay Area. Situated approximately 35 miles east of San Francisco, San Ramon is a suburban community whose residents are professionals in the high-tech industry, retail, education, healthcare, business and service industries. The CHS student body mirrors its community's socio-economic and educational diversity. The approximate ethnic/racial make-up of our student population is: 46.7% Asian, 29.5% Caucasian, 11.9% Hispanic/Latino, 9.1% Two or more races, 2.2% African American, 0.5% Pacific Islander, 0.1% Native American. There are 115 certificated teachers on staff this year.

Information Related to COVID-19

Spring 2020: Due to COVID-19 and our shift to remote learning during this time, SRVUSD implemented a Pass/No Mark grading system for the 4th quarter and second semester final grade.

2020-2021: CHS was 100% distance learning until March 2021, when students had a choice to return to campus or remain fully remote. In 2020-2021, all students were given letter grades for both semesters.

August 2021: Pursuant to AB104, students had the option to request Pass/No Pass for the 2020-2021 school year.

2021-2022: CHS returned to fully in-person instruction.

Information & Policies

Grading System

- Students earn 5 credits per semester course they pass with a D- or higher. GPA is calculated on a 4-point scale, with C's or higher in Honors (H) or Advanced Placement (AP) courses receiving an additional honors point. +/- do not impact GPA. Athletics and Teacher's Aide do not earn letter grades, earning a P/NP instead and are not factored into GPA.
- Rank/Decile is not computed per District Policy.

Academic Policies

- Students must enroll in a five- or six-period day for all four years of high school.
- Students may enroll in a seventh class, but freshman and sophomores are only able to if the class is part of a specific academic or co-curricular program
- (Journalism, Leadership, Performing Arts, Publications, or [previously] AVID). If a student withdraws from a class after the 3rd week of a semester, they will receive a NM (No Mark) or F on their transcript, per teacher discretion.
- Students may opt to take up to 40 credits of subject/elective requirements through approved outside institutions. There are other flexible options available to students through our Personalized Learning program. SRVUSD Personalized Learning website.

Updates

- Students may only enroll in one lab science course. They have the opportunity to enroll in an additional science pathway course or science elective.
- AVID is no longer offered at Cal High.

Project Lead the Way Pathways (PLTW)


College Connect – A program offered by the school district to support students in completing up to 30 units of college credits at Diablo Valley College prior to graduation from high school.
